



Founded in 1977, Christian Life School is a Kindergarten-12th grade independent, evangelical, interdenominational, coeducational, college-preparatory day school in Kenosha, Wisconsin. Located midway between Milwaukee, Wisconsin and Chicago, Illinois, the 350,000 sq. ft. of building and athletic fields are on a 45-acre campus in a rapidly growing business and professional community of 100,000 people. Students from the six-county area of Southeastern Wisconsin and Northeastern Illinois commute to the central campus for a 7-hour, 9-class period school day 180 days per year.
